Global Education



The **California Global Education Project (CGEP)** inspires and supports educators to develop global competence for active citizenship in all K–12 students. CGEP helps teachers prepare students to explore and investigate their local and global communities, recognize different perspectives, communicate ideas effectively and take informed action on issues of local and global significance. CGEP aims to empower students — who will live and work in an increasingly interconnected world — to be resilient innovators, influencers and leaders equipped with the knowledge, skills and dispositions described in the global competence framework.

CGEP expands participants' geographic perspectives and understanding of the world's diverse cultures and environments. Programs are designed to show teachers and their students the interconnectedness of people, events, places and issues. Key themes include human rights, conflict and resolution, environmental sustainability, migration, and peace and justice.

CGEP works with teachers across disciplines and grade levels to address all of the California frameworks and standards in addition to initiatives in environmental literacy, STEAM education, media literacy and career and technical education.

IMPACT

The CGEP (formerly the California International Studies Project) has advocated for global education in K–12 education for more than three decades. CGEP has:

- Maintained a statewide network of professional growth to strengthen teachers' subject knowledge, cultural knowledge, instructional skills and dispositions required for global competence
- Provided stability for regional sites through their integration into the institutional fabric of sponsoring universities
- Supported efforts to maintain a stable, statewide system of professional growth in all K–12 teaching subjects in collaboration with other CSMPs, the California Department of Education and other education partners
- Established a program aimed at cultivating students' environmental literacy and informed participation in their local and global communities to address sustainability
- Built strong professional learning communities that contribute to teacher retention
